Sandra Lee Nault, born in Indio, CA on Nov 26, 1953, passed away on May 3, 2021. She was raised and graduated from school in Eagle Mtn, CA. She met and married George Nault in 1983, and lived here since then. During those years, she and George worked at whatever was needed—

whether it be cooking,

bartending or waiting tables—to make the Ocotillo Lodge into the well-known landmark it is today. Sandy had her own hair styling business in Bouse for a number of years until ill health forced her to slow down. Recognized many times for her work for the community, she was instrumental in the building of the Camp Bouse Memorial Monument and was honored by the WW11 tank at the site being named “Sandy” after her.

“She was a fighter,” said George, shaking his head. “That girl never lost hope through 28 years fighting lupus . . . a heart attack, strokes and more. She was the best thing that ever happened to me.”

Other family she leaves behind: her folks, Dick & JoAnn Dennis, who have lived in Bouse for 40 years, a sister, Carolyn, brothers Richard and Paul, and step sibs John, Steve, George, Tim, Scott, Sharon, & Karen.

A Celebration of Sandy's Life will be held on Nov 26, at 5pm for Sandy's friends and loved ones, hosted at the Ocotillo Lodge. Finger-foods, no host bar, and music by Gypsy Rose. Please join us.

9/11 Memories Told by BES Student Essays

VFW Auxiliary Post 2357 sponsored an Essay Contest for the children of Bouse this summer. The children were asked to ask an adult where they were and what they were doing when they learned of the tragedy on September 11, 2001, and how they felt. The kids did a great job!

Each child received a gift for participating and the three winners received a \$25 Wal-Mart gift card! “We read the essays as part of our September 11th Memorial at our Post,” said Auxiliary member, Kerrie McBain.

“Thank you to all of the students for your entries. Picking winners was a hard decision! Thanks to all of the adults who participated too! We’re figuring a way to share all the essays with you . . . we’ll keep you posted!”

One of the three winning entries will be shown in each of Oct, Nov, and Dec Newsletters.

“Where were you on 9/11? I myself wasn’t alive yet, but I know many people who were. This was a scaring, life changing event for many people and so it has held an important place in our country’s memories.

My grandma was working at a hotel in Chandler that was close to a nuclear plant so when she heard the news about the towers she was scared that the terrorists would crash the plant and kill more people. Many of her friends were terrified.

My mom didn’t know until she got to school where they showed the news every morning. Her classmates were terrified. She felt sad for everyone who was dying. She doesn’t remember everything that happened, but she does remember feeling scared of dying.”

Museum Welcomes New Hosts



Drop by the Bouse Museum and say hi to Jeff and Carolyn, Thurs Nov 4 through Sun Nov 7 from 10-2 . . . and weekly thereafter through March.

This will be the second season for the addition to the original historic Assay Office, which now provides much expanded displays of Camp Bouse memorabilia and history. While you’re there, be sure to watch the video featuring the 13 WW11 training camps scattered across desert parts of CA, NV, and AZ in the 1940s, of which Camp Bouse has a unique history as the only “secret camp” of Patton’s Desert Training Center.

The Museum has operated since the mid-1990s after the Chamber’s purchase and renovation done totally by volunteers. Memorabilia and artifacts, memories and photos, all fixtures and furniture have been gathered and donated by resident families to depict the history of the Bouse area.

There is no fee to visit, souvenirs are available for sale, and we ask that you leave your pets at home or in the car during your visit.

Bring your laptop to find out where and why your ancestors came to America. European people have been coming to North America for a thousand years. The Vikings made a temporary settlement in Newfoundland around 1000 A.D.

The more permanent European settlements, however, were established during the late 16th and early 17th centuries. It was in 1607 with the English settlement of Jamestown in Virginia that large numbers of civilian European immigrants came to stay in North America on a permanent basis. Beginning with the Mayflower—thirteen years later—and all the ships coming to New England in the Great Migration in the following decades, you will be able to find all sorts of immigration records up to the present day. Since everyone in America has some ancestral roots that begin elsewhere, except for full-blooded Native Americans, that means everyone who is a genealogist can potentially benefit from researching immigration records.



We are getting ready for another busy season! We've run 246 calls as of 10/24/21. Please stay safe everyone and use caution when you are out and about, watch that other guy when you're driving.

We'll be starting the expansion petitions anew soon. The Covid-19 stopped us in our tracks and we were unable to finish the last few signatures needed. We will be holding another meeting immediately following our regular Board meeting on Nov. 9. Anyone interested or needing more information please try to attend. The office is open Mon-Thurs, 9am-3pm for more questions or information. Please don't hesitate to stop by or call me at any of the numbers listed above. This expansion is necessary for us to continue answering calls in the 42 area and to continue compensating our staff when the SAFER grant expires next year.

Fire season is not over and we ask everyone to check their permits and renew them asap. The response by our community has been great and the community has benefited from the program. Illegal burns are still happening but at a much lower extent. Burning without a permit, and not following the guidelines set by AZDEQ is not good for our community or your neighbors. Household trash, Oleanders, and palm tree trunks are NOT ALLOWED at any time. Fire must not be lit until 1 hour after sunrise and be out 1 hour before sunset. This does not apply to a warming fire BUT it may not contain any of the previously mentioned items. A BIG Thank You out to all the participants this last year.

What a great Red Ribbon Parade, enjoyed seeing all the participation again this year. Good Job by all!

The Fire Dept has FREE smoke detectors available again this year. Call or stop by to pick yours up anytime, the staff can also assist to install them if needed.
